

Kindly refer to the subject noted above.

I am directed to inform you that the following decisions have been taken with respect to Indira Gandhi Drinking Water Supply Scheme :-

- (i) The time period for completion of Indira Gandhi Drinking Water Scheme is extended upto 31.3.2013
- (ii) The connection fee of Rs. 500/- in rural areas and Rs. 1000/- in the urban areas has been further waived off upto 31.3.2013.
- (iii) The Chief Minister has ordered that the work under Indira Gandhi Water Supply Scheme be completed during the current financial year. No further extension would be granted.

Subject:- Indira Gandhi Water Supply scheme

Haryana Government launched a novel scheme by the name of Indira Gandhi Drinking Water Scheme in November, 2006. Under this scheme, about 10 lac Scheduled Caste households in the rural and urban areas were to be provided water connections, free of cost.

A 200 litre HDPE water tank fitted with a tap and other accessories is being provided in the premises of Scheduled Caste households. In addition, a 50% concession on water charges has been given to Scheduled Caste households.

Since the inception of this programme, the year-wise physical and financial progress is as follows :-

Initially, the Indira Gandhi Drinking Water Supply scheme was launched to provide 8 lacs private water connections to scheduled caste-households in the State in a period of three years. The 8 lacs number of scheduled caste households were estimated on the basis of scheduled caste population and household size in the State. However, when the work was started in villages, the number of scheduled caste households increased to more than the estimated number in villages. The increase in number of SC households has also been due to nuclearisation. Youths, after marriage, normally have a tendency to get new ration cards. In view of this the total number of SC households have increased to 10.36 lacs.

Out of 10.36 lacs Scheduled Caste households, 9.95 lac SC households have been provided water connections uptill 31.3.2012, leaving a balance of 0.41 lac SC households as on 1.4.2012.

Further, the delay in covering all SC households has occurred due to the fact that the infrastructure in the villages in particular, was also improved simultaneously so as to ensure that drinking water was made available to all SC households, with adequate pressure. This new infrastructure, created consists of additional tubewells, boosting stations and laying of additional pipelines etc.

Urban Areas. During the current financial year, a sum of Rs. 40 crore will be spent on this scheme.

In view of the above, the time period of the scheme needs to be extended upto 31.3.2013.

Further, the connection fee of Rs. 500/- in the rural areas and Rs. 1000/- in the urban areas was not to be charged for a period of one year with effect from 19.11.2006 and this was subsequently extended upto 31.3.2012,

It is therefore submitted that this concession may also be extended upto 31.3.2013.

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Thus, the following decisions are required to be taken please.

- (i) The time period for completion of Indira Gandhi Drinking Water Scheme be extended upto 31.3.2013
